The Microeconomics and Public Economics unit (Section AE1) of the Department of Economics at Maastricht University is seeking to appoint a senior faculty member as a tenured full professor in the fields of microeconomics, economic theory, industrial organization, behavioral and experimental economics (including neuroeconomics), public economics or political economy.

The appointment is part of the School's strategy BRIDGE to strengthen its research profile. The appointment comes with reduced teaching load in the first three years of the appointment. The Microeconomics and Public Economics unit (AE1) offers a strongly research oriented English speaking international environment. Next to the reduced teaching load for the first three years of appointment, the successful candidate can also profit from AE1's internal incentive system which rewards high quality research output and acquisition of research funds with less teaching load.

Applicants should have proven their high research quality through publications in high-ranked peer reviewed journals. The ideal candidate will have published in the top-5. The successful candidate is expected to continue publishing in high-ranked journals. In addition, the candidate is expected to actively engage in securing research grants on a national and international level. The successful candidate is expected to be willing to teach in the area of economic theory and behavior at the undergraduate and graduate level. The language of instruction is English. The successful candidate is also expected to actively participate in the self-administration of the department.

*Salary:*

Salary is competitive, depending on qualifications and work experience and ranges from €4904,00 to €8622,00 (12 monthly payments) based on a fulltime job. On top of this, there is an 8% holiday allowance and an 8.3% year-end bonus. Non-Dutch applicants coming from abroad could be eligible for a favorable tax treatment (30% tax regulation).
